MARY D. WILLIAMS has performed the songs and told the stores of the Black South for over 25 years. She has traveled to colleges, public schools, churches, libraries to share her knowledge and art. Along with Dr. Timothy B. Tyson, she has taught a community-based college course, "The South in Black and White," to over a thousand students at Duke University. Mary can be heard on the soundtrack for Hollywood movies, television, at theatres and featured on NPR "When you listen to Mary D. Williams," Professor Craig Werner has said "you're hearing the voice of a great singer, but you're also hearing the voices of the elders and the ancestors."

VIRLANA TKACZ heads the Yara Arts Group and has directed over thirty original shows at La MaMa Theatre in New York, as well as in Kyiv, Lviv, Kharkiv, Bishkek, Ulaanbaatar, and Ulan Ude. She has co-produced a series of concerts and recordings of Buryat Mongolian artists and of the Koliadnyky of Kryvorivnia from the Carpathian Mountains. She has also worked with Kyrgyz artists to create two theatre pieces based on Kyrgyz epics songs.

JULIAN KYTASTY grew up within a strong tradition of family music-making. He is a third generation bandurist following in the footsteps of his father Petro and grandfather Ivan Kytasty, and is recognized for his performance of Ukrainian epic songs. He works frequently with Yara Arts Group, most recently on a series of virtual events exploring the life and work of NY bandurist Zinoviy Shtokalko. His work on Yara's 1917-2017 Tychyna, Zhadan, and the Dogs earned him a NY Innovative Theater Award for best original score.

IRYNA VOLOSHYNA is a folklorist working with Yara Arts Group. Originally from Khmelnystkyi, Ukraine, she sang with Ladovytsi. In New York, she is a member of Ukrainian Village Voices and works at the Ukrainian Museum. She is a doctoral student at Indiana University.

WALDEMART KLYUZKO is an artist from Kyiv who has collaborated with Yara Arts Group since 2010, most recently creating the set for *Opera GAZ*. He is a visual artist who has had exhibits at La MaMa Galleria, the Ukrainian Institute of America and the Bezpala Gallery in Toronto.

DARIEN FIORINO is at Cornell University studying environmental science and performing arts. He was in Yara's *Winter Songs on Mars* and 1917/2017: *Tychyna, Zhadan, and the Dogs* at La MaMa.
